Curation “shrink wraps” skills of researching, locating, collecting, filtering, organizing, and compiling information into collections, guides, snapshots, and galleries to profile or present content. Curation has become an increasingly common concept; today’s information overload has pushed it onto everyone’s to-do lists. Instructors are typically in the driver’s seat, culling through resources for student use. This session does not advocate taking our instructional design and pedagogy jobs away, but it does push for giving students increasing responsibility for collating information and source material frequently, using variable tools. Why do we want students to “co-own” curation duties? First, they are “Google-ized”...there is rarely a question that many students think cannot be answered in any top 10 Google results. We want them to be able to locate information, but –more important – to determine relevance. Second, they (like we) suffer from information overload and have inefficient skills in organizing and retrieving information. Third, they need help in learning how to make astute judgments about credible sources to meet academic demands. Finally, they need guidance in using smart filters to use resources for answering academic questions, compiling academic products, and tailoring their responses based on varying types of learning tasks. In this session, Kathleen Gradel will illustrate just a few tools and real course examples, to highlight how curation makes sense within the instructional flow.
