- Centro is the public transportation provider for Onondaga, Oswego, Cayuga, and Oneida counties, which includes the cities of Syracuse, Oswego, and Fulton. Inter-city service connects Syracuse and Onondaga County with the city of Oswego.
- · Centro provides students with transportation around the SUNY Oswego campus and within the city of Oswego.
- Centro stops at the Regional Transportation Center, where the Greyhound, Trailways, and Amtrak connections are located.

These **FREE** routes can help you get around campus and places including Rice Creek Field Station or the Village.

The **Blue Route** travels in twenty-minute intervals between the Marano Campus Center and The Village with multiple stops in front of various residence halls.

The **Green Route** travels in thirty-minute intervals from the Marano Campus Center to the Romney Field House and Rice Creek Field Station.

SUNY Oswego students with a valid student ID with a Student Association sticker may ride Centro free on all Oswego City routes.

Regional **Transportation Center**

The William F. Walsh Regional Transportation Center (RTC) is Central New York's transportation center for inter-city and local travel via Centro, Greyhound, Trailways, and Amtrak.

Syracuse Hancock **International Airport**

The airport is Central New York's gateway to the world with nonstop service to 24 cities across the East Coast, Midwest, and West.

The airport includes two concourses and 20 gates serving six airlines.
